

Start your magical Manistique visit on the shore of Lake Michigan



From the first of May through Memorial Day you will want to take a relaxing drive along the US-2 Top of the Lake Pure Michigan Byway. Enjoy the many places to stop and enjoy the sights and sounds of Lake Michigan before the summer crowds descend on the harbor town of Manistique.



Seul Choix Pointe Lighthouse

The Seul Choix Light is a lighthouse located in the northwest corner of Lake Michigan in Schoolcraft County, Michigan. The station was established in 1892 with a temporary light, and this light started service in 1895, and was fully automated in 1972. It is an active aid to navigation. There is now a museum at the light and both the building and the grounds are open for visitors from Memorial Day until the middle of October.



Carl D Bradley Lakeview Memorial Park

Located on US HWY 2 in Manistique, MI The park was renamed in July of 2014 after the famous Shipwreck of the Carl D. Bradley.



Manistique Boardwalk

The Manistique Boardwalk stretches along Lake Michigan's north shoreline. It's an easy, level, two-mile walk for everyone to enjoy the beautiful sunrises, sunsets, or the day. The wood and cement boardwalk features three bridges, several benches, observation and interpretation areas, and a great view of the lighthouse.



East Breakwater Lighthouse

The East Breakwater Lighthouse, built in 1916, is 35 feet tall and stands at the harbor entrance of the Manistique River. The light is housed in a bright-red square tower that is capped by a black parapet lantern room. A black staircase climbs up from the pier several feet to a door at the bottom of the tower. Only a few small round windows allow light into the interior of this structure. Parking for visitors is available at Lakeview Park, the city beach and marina.

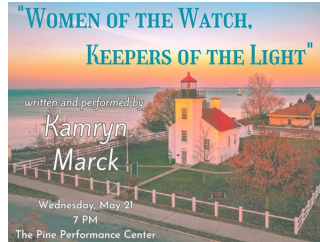
